Check-in: Not required if your dog's height card is on file with COKC. **Exception:** If this is your first time at a COKC agility trial, you must show your height card to the Trial Secretary.

The only dogs that can compete with a temporary card are dogs that are under 2 years of age. Once a dog turns 2 years, the dog requires an official measurement and a permanent card. The official height will be circled on the dog's ID card.

Dog Measuring, Briefing and Set-up Times: Details will be included with your trial confirmation.

*Trial Site: **Limited camping on site. Self-contained units only. First come, first served. Important Note: You are responsible for providing your own shade.***

For this trial we will be using ring 1 only. It is the larger ring directly behind (south) of the club building.

Benching/Crating: Outdoor crating in your vehicle is recommended. If you wish to use a shade tent, it should be set up on either side of ring 1, but not directly in front of it. No chairs or crates are permitted ringside.

No Food Available on Site Please bring your own food and drink **Or you can drive back into Brandon (approximately four miles to fast food with drive throughs)**

Prizes and Awards: Ribbons for qualifying rounds and placements/rosettes for all titles. Ribbons will be self-serve at this trial. If your dog obtains a title, please let the trial secretary know so the appropriate rosette can be presented to you.

AAC ID Cards:

All dogs competing in an AAC trial **MUST** have their cards with them at the trial! "Pending" entries will not be accepted. These cards are available from AAC at a cost of \$20.00 + GST per dog for AAC members; \$25.00 + GST per dog for all others. *Giant breed dogs measuring over 22" at the shoulder may choose to compete 1 or 2 heights lower in Specials

NOTE: Dogs considered giant breeds (see list below) or mixed breed dogs resembling giant breeds in terms of weight to height ratio, may jump one or two jump heights lower than their measured Regular height when they compete in the Specials category. Dogs that have double dropped in jump height as a Special may enter the Veterans category and receive veteran time at the age of 5. No additional drop in jump height will occur with this move to veterans.

Giant Breeds: Bernese Mountain Dog, Black Russian Terrier, Bloodhound, Bullmastiff, Dogue de Bordeaux, Great Dane, Great Pyrenees, Greater Swiss Mountain Dog, Irish Wolfhound, Kuvasz, Leonberger, Mastiff, Neopolitan Mastiff, Newfoundland (inc. Landseer), Saint Bernard.

Please note: At this time the COKC Agility Committee has decided to not allow Bitches in Season to participate in this agility trial or to be present on the trial grounds.

PLEASE NOTE:

Abuse in any form, of judges, competitors or volunteers will NOT BE TOLERATED!! Anyone disrupting the trial due to poor sportsmanship or abusive behaviour will be DISMISSED from the trial. No fees will be refunded and any legs earned to that point will be null. REMEMBER---This sport is FUN for dog, handler, judges and volunteers!!

Division Descriptions:

- Regular Division:** This division is open to all dogs, 18 months of age or older, as described within the current AAC rules.
- Specials Division:** This division shall be open to all dogs. Once a dog has entered an official trial in the specials class, it may no longer compete in the regular class unless the handler makes a special application entitled "Request for Official Move from Specials Class Level to Regular Class Level". This move may only be done once during a dog's career.
- Veterans Division:** This division is for dogs seven years of age or older. This class is also open to dogs five years of age or older who have been competing in the specials class level for a minimum of twelve months.
- Double Drop Veterans Category:** This category is for handlers who opt to have their dogs jump **two** heights lower than the Regular Category (when a lower jump height is available).
- Junior Handler Category:** This category is for youths who are registered with the Junior Handler program and have been issued a Junior Handler ID number. Entries are made under the Junior Handler ID number, not the dog's ID number. Qualifying scores are recorded under the Junior Handler ID, and **do not** count towards titles for the dog.
- Accessibility Option:** Senior handlers (65 years and over) and handlers with disability may request a modified course time and a modified points requirement. Proof of age or disability is not required. **Please indicate in the area on the entry form if you are entering using the Accessibility option and also indicate your dog's entry category.**

Class Descriptions:

- Standard Class:** This class demonstrates proficiency on all agility obstacles in a numbered course.
- Gamblers Class:** This game demonstrates the handler's strategy and the dog's ability to work at a distance from the handler. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points as possible during the opening sequence and successfully complete the Gamble.
- Snooker Class:** This game demonstrates the handler and dog's versatility as they work together against the clock. The object of the game is to accumulate as many points by successfully completing as many obstacles as possible in the prescribed order within time.
- Jumpers Class:** This game demonstrates a dog's natural jumping ability. The dog is required to complete a course comprised of jumps and tunnels as prescribed by the judge.
- Biathlon Agility Class:** This class demonstrates proficiency on all agility obstacles in a numbered course. It is open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at the Starters, Advanced or Masters Level.
- Biathlon Jumpers Class:** This class demonstrates a dog's natural jumping ability, and the dog's ability to weave. The dog is required to complete a course comprised of jumps, tunnels and weaves. This class is open to all dogs eligible to compete in other AAC qualifying events at the Starters, Advanced or Masters Level.

General Notice to Exhibitors:

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of AAC rules and regulations, including but not limited to the following:

- This event is held under AAC rules and regulations and is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age, purebred or mixed breed, except bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance.
- Obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the rules and regulations of the AAC and shall conform to AAC specifications.
- The only dogs that can compete with a temporary card are dogs that are under 2 years of age. Once a dog turns 2 years, the dog requires an official measurement and a permanent card. The official height will be circled on the dog's ID card. Owners are reminded to always have their ID card(s) with them at a trial should it be required.
- Exhibitors must keep crate and exercise areas clean. Please pick up after yourself and your dog.
- The host club reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- After closing date, refunds will only be given to competitors if a bitch comes into season or the dog or handler is injured sufficiently to prevent them from competing. The trial secretary must be informed prior to the trial date and a certificate from a veterinarian or doctor must be provided.
- Competitors whose dogs measure up may run For Exhibition Only (FEO) if the dog is not prepared to jump the higher heights. No qualifying scores or awards may be earned.
- **FEO Runs:** COKC accepts For Exhibition Only (FEO) runs. Dogs entering FEO runs must have a valid Dog ID Number and meet all other AAC eligibility criteria. An FEO dog is permitted to run at any jump height, in any class, at any performance level and in any category at the handler's discretion. A dog may not enter a class as FEO if it is also entered in the same class for qualification. In accordance with AAC rules, toys will be allowed in the ring during an FEO run. Toys may be of any general configuration, and must be in a good state of repair (no fur or stuffing coming loose). Handlers are permitted to interact with their dogs during a run by tugging with the toy. Use of sealed food containers in the ring during an FEO run will be allowed. Food containers must be made of such material, structure and in such a way as to ensure there is no leakage of crumbs or treats, and no chance of accidental spillage should the container be tossed, dropped or grabbed by the dog. The handler cannot feed the dog during the run, or in the ring. **Audible toys and audible training aids (e.g. clickers, whistles) are NOT permitted in the ring.** Please be considerate of the dogs competing on course before and after you as the toy may cause a distraction.
- Entry forms may be photocopied, but **MUST** include the entry form, waiver form, agreement and signature in their entirety. A separate entry is to be submitted for each dog.
- Entries and payment must be received by the closing date and are payable in Canadian Funds.
- By AAC rules, entries are not valid until full payment of entry fees has been made. Tendering of an NSF cheque in payment of entry fees shall be considered non-payment of entry. In addition, there will be a \$25.00 service charge for each returned cheque, regardless of whether the dog/handler compete in the event.
- All entries will be confirmed via email only where a valid address is supplied. If supplying an email address please ensure that it is valid and legible. If you don't have a valid email address and want your confirmation emailed, please ask a friend to receive it for you.
- No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Acts of God, public emergency, an act of public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- We will accommodate handlers running more than one dog to the extent possible. Running order will be determined at the club's discretion. Any dog and handler not present for their run when their name is called will be ineligible to run, unless prior arrangements are made with the gate steward.
- Except in FEO runs, no food, toys or any other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time. Toys and food shall not be permitted within 10 feet of the ring. Please be considerate of competitors and refrain from using clickers or squeaky toys while a dog is in the ring.
- All dogs must be penned, crated or leashed when not in the ring, and may not be tied to any obstacle, permanent or temporary anywhere on the grounds of the trial site. Dogs are not to be left unattended unless appropriately crated. Please take responsibility for your dogs and children. Any exhibitor whose dogs or children create unnecessary disturbances or engage in unsafe or disruptive behaviour may be asked to leave the trial site. There will be no refunds for entries if an exhibitor is dismissed from competition for any reason.
